For
Students Who Have Been Sexually Assaulted
Developed by Indiana University-Purdue University Fort Wayne
(2013-2014)

Instructions: A staff member reviews this form with the survivor to ensure that issues and resources have been relayed to the survivor.

1. _____ You have the **right to seek medical treatment** and to do an anonymous rape kit (Jane Doe law, 2007) at the **Sexual Assault Treatment Center (260) 423-2222**. The Sexual Assault Treatment Center (SATC) provides first-response medical forensic examinations to women, children and men who have been victims of sexual assault. Services are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, at no cost to the patient. The SATC responds to sexual assaults in Allen County and the fifteen surrounding counties.
2. _____ You have the **right to file a report with University Police (260) 481-6827 or FWPD 911**. Even if you choose not to report it now, you may change your mind and report later.
3. _____ You have the **right to know that Housing Staff must report to University Police** that a sexual assault has occurred. Your name does not have to be disclosed. This information is compiled pursuant to federal law (Clery) that requires the University to disclose annual information on campus crime and security.
4. _____ You have the **right to a learning environment free from sexual harassment and assault**. Any employee, student, campus visitor or person participating in a University activity, whether on or off campus, who believes he or she has experienced or witnessed discrimination and/or harassment is encouraged to report the incident(s) promptly to the **Office of Institutional Equity /Title IX Coordinator (260) 481- 6106**. The University reserves the right to investigate circumstances that may involve discrimination and/or harassment where no complaint, formal or informal, has been filed.
5. _____ You have the **right to change academic and/or living situations**.
6. _____ You have the **right to receive the "Sexual Assault: What it is, What to Do and Where to go" pamphlet** provided by the Office of Institutional Equity and/or your Resident Assistant (RA)/Resident Director.
7. _____ You have the **right to file a disciplinary complaint through the Office of the Dean of Students (260) 481-6601** or accessing the form online www.ipfw.edu/dean. IPFW has a disciplinary process for violations of the Student Code of Rights, Responsibilities, and Conduct. The accuser and accused must have the same opportunity to have an advisor present during the process. Both parties shall be informed of the outcome of any disciplinary proceeding.
